

YEAR 7 CATCH UP PREMIUM REPORT 2015-16

Focus: *The Year 7 catch-up premium allocations for 2015 to 2016 are based on £500 for each pupil as follows a year 7 pupil (or year group X and aged 11) recorded on the October 2015 school census and recorded in the 2015 key stage 2 assessment data as not having achieved level 4, 5 or 6 in reading or mathematics. www.gov.uk*

Our rationale for deployment of the grant is:

- To support the attainment of pupils and enable them to make the transition into the Secondary phase of the school.
- All of our eligible pupils are working significantly below level 4 at the end of key stage 2 as a result of their SEN.
- In evaluation of the grant we have considered expected progress, and the strategies which are required to be in place to support the transition process.

In 2015-2016 we received £6,500 which was spent on:

- Transition preparation sessions which was supported by Head of Department and Higher Level Teaching Assistant.
- Individual interventions for students in Reading or Number delivered by a Higher Level Teaching Assistant.

The outcome of this was:

Average progress made by year 7 pupils (13 students) in 2015-16 was

In 2016-17 there are 6 year 7 pupils who are eligible for the grant.

Our plan for the deployment of the grant:

- Strategies to support pupils with attachment when transitioning delivered by SENCO and Family Support Worker including visual resources to support awareness of team (individual and team meetings).

- Visual strategies including a booklet and videos on changes to systems and structures.
- Transition meetings with in school professionals as part of induction into the Secondary Department - this links to Safeguarding, who to talk to if you are worried about something (posters, discrete sessions with students, training for staff).
